Part 2 What to do next?

Overall Scope of Work over next 5 years

- ~770 shrubs and ~ 50 trees were missing at TCC from surveys
- ~ 270 shrubs were replaced, (22 by 5 residents) so approximately ~ 450 to go, not including any attrition in the meantime.
- 16 trees were replaced and we lost 6 more recently so we need to replace 40 missing trees.
- Continue to Improve existing plantings with trimming and timely maintenance
- Clear dead/rogue trees, branches, and shrubs, restore what can be saved.
- Stay consistent to a master plan for condos and townhouses
- Enhance plantings at entrances, around the clubhouse and "featured" locations
- Develop Community Garden for residents? So far issue hasn't taken hold.

Landscape-- Possible Landscape work for 2021 Based on criteria developed for replacement

- 1. Irrigation Audit-- highest priority so we can assure newest plantings and future plantings will survive. Repair/add lines and heads add as needed.
- Replace 7 remaining ornamental trees missing in front of buildings 01, 08, 11, 25, 26, 29 and 21 (that one is all but dead). That would complete all of the ornamentals in front of condos.
- 3. Replace 6 shrubs that were removed because they were overgrown and obstructive (and dangerous) 1 on northeast side of building 04 and 5 on the north side of building 24, north side. Replace dead evergreen tree in front of clubhouse.

6. Replace **45** missing shrubs at **building 31** (East, north and west sides).

8. Plant 2 small sun tolerant evergreen shrubs in bed near compactor, 9. Replace diseased knock out roses on west side of the clubhouse

• Funding:

- HOA budget,
- Owners who want to contribute to replacing missing shrubs near their building
- Solicit contributions from residents who want enhance the common grounds.

Community Garden

Concept agreed upon by board and landscape committee thus far:

- Users would be asked to pay a nominal fee based upon space requested.
- Flowers and fruits and veggies would be allowed-- unless contraindicated because of their invasive nature (eg wisteria) or being diseased prone (eg rose rosette disease).
- Fencing would be added to prevent losses from critters.
- Beds would be raised

Considerations mentioned by the board and landscape committee include things like:

Use of fertilizers, pest and weed control agents, use of tools and equipment; limitation of certain forms of vegetation; access to the gardens (pathways), addition of benches. Need for surrounding foliage, permission from city of Leawood.

2020? Community garden-- To do before starting:

- 1. Need to survey residents regarding site preference?
- 2. Check for permission by city of Leawood
- 3. Identify funding for initial and maintenance work-- raised beds, walkways, fencing? plumbing? tools, soil water, fertilizer, etc.
- 4. Identify sources of water for the garden
- 5. Survey number of residents who would participate
- 6. Establish resident participation fee
- 7. Establish rules and regulations

Possible sites, Community Garden:

- 1. Open area in the northeast part of TCC (near 115th and Tomahawk Creek parkway).
- **2.** Just south of the Basketball court
- 3. South of building 26 close to Town Center Parkway
